

Wisconsin Point Preservation

The citizens of Northwest Wisconsin request:

- **That the State of Wisconsin consider a role in the preservation and possible future designation as a state park or state and tribal park, Wisconsin Point, and surrounding public lands.**

There are approximately 1,400 acres of public land, four miles of pristine Lake Superior beach, and approximately five miles of shoreline on Allouez Bay that need protection. This area sees considerable abuse in various forms; including, but not limited to, illegal dumping of a wide variety of debris from construction materials to animal carcasses, vandalism of natural features including trees being cut down, fires in sensitive areas, litter on the beach, cars being broken into and items stolen. The City of Superior does not have the resources to properly protect this area from the many abuses it endures.

The lands owners include the City of Superior, Douglas County, the University of Wisconsin, and also includes an interest by the Fond Du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa. There are many interests to be taken into consideration here. Hunting, Fishing, Swimming, Hiking, Smelting, Cross Country Skiing and Snow Shoeing are just a few. Preservation would promote the area as a place to locate businesses thereby creating jobs and recreationally especially if it were made a State Park.
